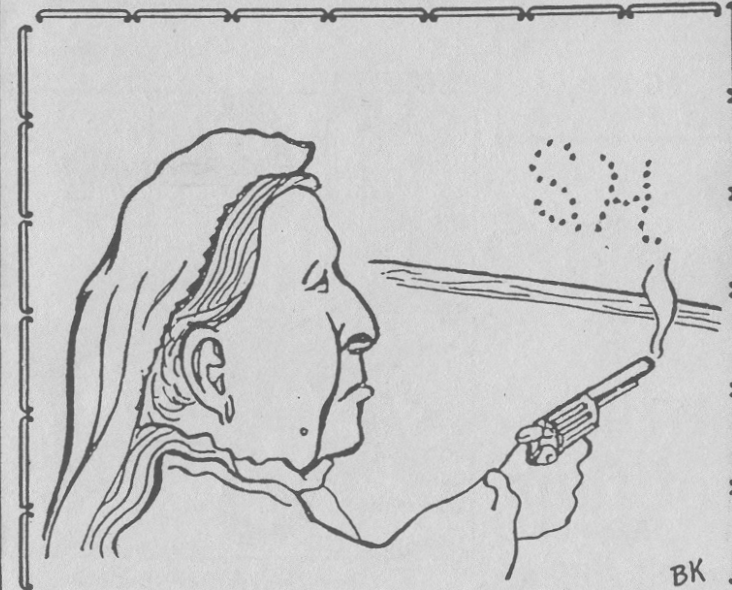

3/4 c. butter 1 c. grated Cheddar cheese
1/3 c. bleu cheese 1/2 clove garlic, minced
1 tsp. chopped parsley 1 t. chopped chives
2 cups sifted flour 1/2 tsp. salt

Cream butter & cheeses. Add remaining ingredients. Shape in 1 1/2" diameter rolls, and chill well. Slice & bake in 375° oven for 8-10 min.
Makes 3 dozen.

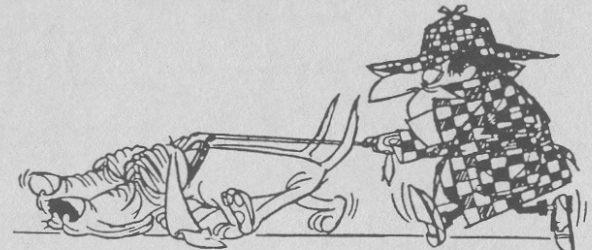
SCANNing the Scion Scene

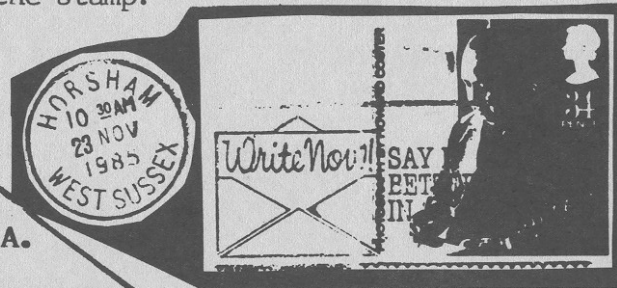

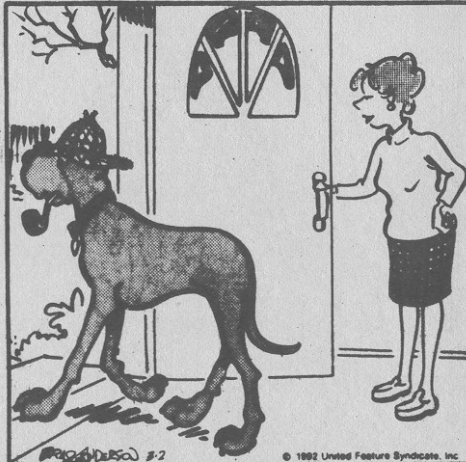
... or Stamping around with SHERLOCK HOLMES

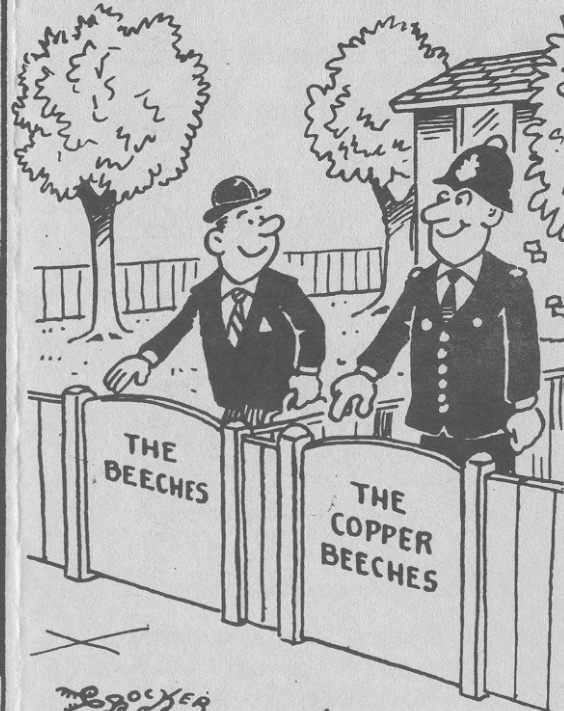
