WOW-WOW SAUCE

(Mrs. Hudson frequently served this traditional

English sauce as a zesty accompaniment to most any meat entrée. A definite palate pleaser.)

|---------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| 2 Tbsps. butter | 2 Tbsps. flour |
| | 1 1/3 cups beef consommé |
| | 1 Tbsp. prepared spicy brown mustard |
| 1 Tbsp. catsup | 1/4 tsp. salt |
| 2 Tbsps. red wine vinegar | Dash of pepper |
| 1 T. Worcestershire | 1 T. chopped parsley |

Melt butter over low heat. Add flour and cook for 3 minutes, stirring constantly. * Slowly add consommé, a little at a time, stirring to avoid lumps. Cook four minutes, stirring constantly, until thick & smooth. * Stir in the remaining ingredients, except the parsley. Cook over low heat for 10 min., stirring occasionally. Stir in parsley just before serving.

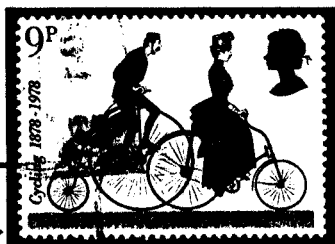
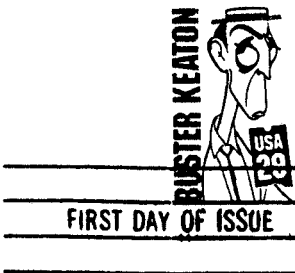
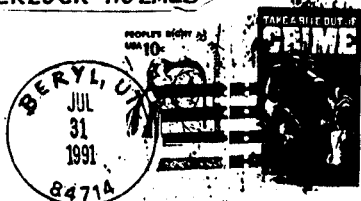
