SAVORY  
MATCHSTICK CARROTS

(Mrs. Hudson borrowed this recipe from Mrs. Warren, of Bloomsbury.)

½ lb. carrots, and 1 small turnip,  
peeled & cut in julienned strips  
½ cup water      3 T. butter, cut into chunks  
½ tsp. dried thyme leaves  
1/8 tsp. each salt & pepper

Place carrot and turnip strips in a medium-sized pan. Add water; cover and bring to a boil. Simmer for 5 to 8 minutes until crisp-tender. Drain vegetables. Melt butter in pan; stir in seasonings. Add carrots and turnips, tossing gently to coat. Serve right on.

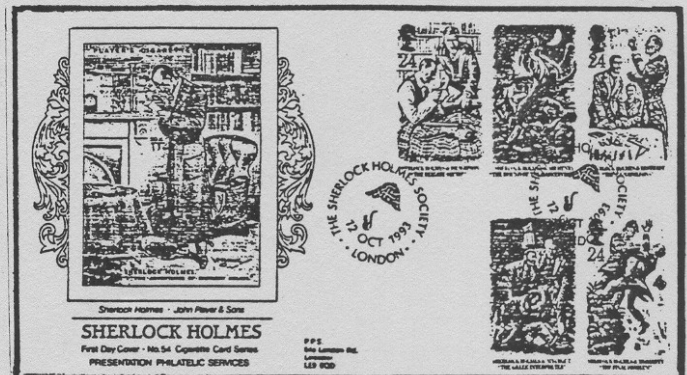
