YORKSHIRE PUDDING

("A succulent roast of beef wi'out Yorkshire Pudding is likened to an Englishman wi'out his pint," so says good Mrs. 'udson. "'Tis easy to make 'n' tasty besides.")

2 eggs 1 cup milk 1 cup flour
½ tsp. salt Beef drippings (about ¼ cup)

Beat together eggs & milk. Sift together flour and salt. Stir into egg mixture. Beat batter until smooth and well-blended. Pour hot drippings into 9x9" baking pan. Pour batter into pan. Bake at 450° for 10 minutes, then reduce heat to 350° & bake for another 10 to 15 minutes 'til puffy & golden brown. Slice into squares & serve with roast. Serves 4.
